

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

EMERGING (AFRICAN) LEADERS PROGRAM

ELP

ELP is a three-year structured excellence in ethics, leadership and innovation program for emerging African Leaders.

Aim: To nurture future African leaders for ethical and innovative leadership

Target: Undergraduates, ages 16-21

Selection Process: Essay writing, oral interviews and background checks.

Present Capacity: Minimum of 25 mentees annually.

Scope: Africa. First efforts in Nigeria.

ELP programs are free of charge to successful applicants.

Nurturing Process

- Foundation Conferences: To broaden the horizon of Emerging Leaders, help them set personal and community development goals as well as dream big.
- Leadership Portfolio Summits: To discuss the progress of their personal development goals and community projects. Mentors offer feedback, encouragement and counseling.
- Community Development Projects: To challenge them to provide innovative solutions to community problems.
- Inspirational Reading: To enhance their ethics, leadership and innovative spirit
- Inspirational Group Film Viewing: To reinforce their social and moral sense, teamwork capabilities and innovative spirit.
- One-on-one Mentoring: To listen to many issues affecting them, provide guidance and monitor progress.
- Leadership-Building Experiences: To help them gain practical knowledge from leaders with demonstrated knowledge, experience and virtues, home and abroad.
- Need-based scholarships: To help those struggling financially to complete school.

Expectations

A. *While in the program, Emerging Leaders:*

- ◆ Develop the habits of highly effective leaders.
- ◆ Promote ethics and excellence in leadership on campus.
- ◆ Provide innovative solutions to community problems through their community projects

B. *Upon completion of the program, at which time they have also graduated from the University, CSAEINC:*


- ◆ Works with them to secure jobs or initiate enterprises in areas of market demand.

ELP COSTS: 2013- 2016


ELP Cost in Naira

CSAAEINC OPPORTUNITY FAIR COF


COF is an integrated career-building program.

Among other things, COF teaches students how to:


- Become successful entrepreneurs




₦2,290,000.74 spent on Opportunity Fairs.

2,200 Students have attended the Opportunity Fairs




